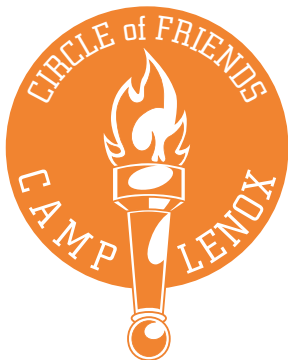

## EARLY BIRD ENROLLMENT

For those of you who like to plan ahead, we thought it would be a good idea to let you know your early enrollment options for 2010. Based on current interest, we anticipate camp to fill quickly for 2010. We want to extend enrollment savings to all our current families. Below are the timelines and payment options that are available through September 30, 2009.

Full summer tuition prepayment in full:

**(9100.00 less 10%) \$8190.00**

Full summer early enrollment registration:

**\$9100.00 (deposit \$2000.00)**

Half summer early enrollment registration:

**\$5500.00 (deposit \$2000.00)**

Our adjusted 2010 tuition rates will be available beginning July 18, 2009.

<p><b>Whitewater Rafting</b></p> <p>This is an exciting 1 day trip of whitewater fun. Rapids are easy to moderate in difficulty. Only certified whitewater instructors are used.</p>	\$100
<p><b>Paintball</b></p> <p>3 fun filled day trips to a major outdoor paintball field. Group rental includes all equipment, CO<sub>2</sub>, and paintballs. This program is only offered to campers 13 years and older.</p>	\$170

## LENOX IS GOING GREEN

There is no better time to begin our environmentally friendly campaign than this coming summer. We have made great strides moving closer to being an environmentally friendly community. These changes will come in stages, and as we all work together, our hope is that Lenox will become a model community of environmentally sound practices. Beginning this summer:

1. All of our cleaning products for the cabins, buildings, and dining room are "green products", which are environmentally safe.
2. All our Styrofoam and plastic dinnerware is now made of products that are biodegradable and can be composted.
3. We are using recycled plastic garbage bags, recycled shipping boxes, recycled toilet paper and recycled cardboard.
4. All cardboard boxes will be grinded for compost material and biodegradable.
5. We plan to cut overall paper usage by 25% this summer

This is a big first step and will be a springboard for further changes next summer. We are asking all parents to help us by **NOT SENDING BOTTLED WATER AND BEVERAGES** to camp. Our water originates from a pristine spring well 250' below ground and is of the highest quality. The large amount of plastic that comes into camp causes a well documented problem of plastic (not biodegradable) in the landfills. Please send your child to camp with one water bottle and a large cup for drinking water.
